The next holiday to celebrate is June 14th, Flag Day. The annual Flag Day Service mandated under Section 2.030 of the Laws of the Order of Elks will be held on Sunday, June 14th. I hope that you and your guests will join us for breakfast and our flag day service which is open to the public. It will feature our scouts as our flag bearers. More details are on page 5 of this publication. Did you know that it took more than a century after the creation of America's flag for anyone to suggest a holiday to honor it. In 1885, a Wisconsin grade school teacher named Bernard Cigrand held what's believed to be the first recognized Flag Day, which began a lifelong quest to establish a formal holiday. Woodrow Wilson issued a presidential proclamation calling for a June 14 commemoration in 1916, but it wasn't until 1949, 16 years after the death of the Cigrand, the "father of Flag Day," that Congress passed legislation as a national holiday.

SOMEONE TO KNOW

Are you a native of Florida?

"No, I was born in Vermont and moved down to Florida in 2004 three months before Hurricane Charlie."

You have the distinguished honor of being an Eagle Scout. How has being an Eagle Scout prepared you for the future?

"It taught me how to work with a group of people and how to get them to focus on one task. Which can be a challenge with a group of kids. I believe that if you can deal with some of the kids then everything else should be a piece of cake. "

You have an Associate Degree from Valencia College and are currently attending the University of Florida, what is your major and your plans for the future? Do you have a special person who influenced you to pursue your education?

"My major is Secondary Education and I'm on the Social Sciences Track. Basically, I am planning on teaching History which was always my favorite subject in school. I had a lot of really good teachers through the years who were all very passionate about what they do and I want to teach kids about something that I really enjoy."

What do you think it takes to be successful in today's society?

"To work hard and not get distracted by stupid things. With so much technology in our lives you really need to know how to use it to your advantage or you'll get left in the dust."

Working in the kitchen at the Kissimmee Elks Lodge, you have exhibited a great willingness to learn, you have great work ethics and have demonstrated an ability to be highly motivated. Where does this positive energy come from? You also have become an awesome cook.

Besides being a staff member with the Scouts, holding a job, pursuing an Education, what do you do in your spare time?

"I try to get out of my house and go hiking or camping, which is difficult right now. Usually there's a lot of multitasking which means doing schoolwork while camping which is always fun."

Your parents are dedicated outstanding Scout leaders and have influenced many young Scouts and have been a guiding factor in Scouts achieving the rank of an Eagle Scout, what advice would you give to young Scouts having an interest in Scouting?

"The biggest problem is the lack of information. Nobody really knows what is happening which is freaking out more people than it should. I'm not worried because almost everyone who gets this virus recovers unless they have other health issues. I think that as long as everyone washes their hands and doesn't do anything stupid then we'll be fine."


RECORDS SET AND SMASHED

Last year was one for the books, to say the least.

We experienced new highs together, and a new and unexpected low as the COVID-19 pandemic changed our lives. But, while our normal shifted, the generosity of the Elks did not.

Despite everything, the Elks helped break-no, shatter-records.

This year, the Elks helped raise an incredible \$6,697,176.55 for the Elks National Foundation, setting an all-time high.



The previous record was set in Fiscal Year 2019, when we reached \$6,597,765.11 in donations. During a pandemic, Elks cleared that record by nearly \$100,000.

And, that wasn't the only record set. For the first time since we started keeping track in FY1993, all 48 state associations achieved the per-member-giving goal.

The <u>2019-20 per-member-giving goal was \$4.75</u>; the Elks blew that out of the water. **ENF donors gave \$8.68 per member-another record set.**

Thank you so much for choosing to support us right now! Your decision means the world to us, and we don't take it for granted.


