# Message To The Members From Theresa (Terry) Hebior, **Exalted Ruler**

This Friday, May 1st we are looking forward to our "first ever" Drive In and Dine from 5-9 in our lodge parking lot. It's our first step to opening our lodge. After that, it's Official! On Friday, May 8th, we will be opening to our members and their guest. We will start with a soft opening on Tuesdays and Fridays. It is finally time to gather!

We will be following the Governor's order of allowing a 25% seating capacity indoors and be seated with 6 feet of distance between tables. Here are some key points for us to follow:

- Do not move tables as they will be staged to meet the 6 foot rule. While this could potentially mean longer wait times for a table, it is necessary. Please allow time for tables to be bussed and sanitized.
- Bar seating will be eliminated until further notice but of course the BAR WILL BE OPEN. Some selections of beer and alcohol may not be available.
- Chef Steve will be in the kitchen cooking on Tuesdays and Fridays from 5-8pm. We will be opening with a volunteer staff only as our general fund has taken a hit from the pandemic. We understand this is a difficult time and hope to have our kitchen staff back together as soon as possible.
- No self service food or condiments will be available.
- Lodge membership cards are required to enter the building using the key card reader. The lounge door has been fixed and must remains closed/locked and not propped open. PLEASE DO NOT PULL ON THE DOOR TO OPEN IT, USE YOUR CARD.
- Our lodge will be open to lodge members and their guest only. We want our members to have a safe place to come, enjoy a meal and the fellowship of other members. As always, we encourage guests to become members and join our Elk family.
- All guests (spouses included) must sign the registry book each time they visit the lodge.
- Finally, I believe the director of the Lake Nona VA Medical Center, Tim Cooke says it best.







# Set of patriotic values aimed at creating a collective American identity

### May 5th, More than Cinco De Mayo Celebrations....

May 5th - Celebrated in Mexico as Cinco de Mayo, a national holiday in remembrance of the Battle of Puebla in 1862, in which Mexican troops under General Ignacio Zaragoza, outnumbered three to one, defeated the invading French forces of Napoleon III.

May 5, 1865 - Decoration Day was first observed in the U.S., with the tradition of decorating soldiers' graves from the Civil War with flowers. The observance date was later moved to May 30th and included American graves from World War I and World War II, and became better known as Memorial Day. In 1971, Congress moved Memorial Day to the last Monday in May, thus creating a three-day holiday weekend.

May 5, 1893 - The Wall Street Crash of 1893 began as stock prices fell dramatically. By the end of the year, 600 banks closed and several big railroads were in receivership. Another 15,000 businesses went bankrupt amid 20 percent unemployment. It was the worst economic crisis in U.S. history up to that time.

May 5, 1961 - Alan Shepard became the first American in space. He piloted the spacecraft *Freedom 7* during a 15-minute 28-second suborbital flight that reached an altitude of 116 miles (186 kilometers) above the earth. Shepard's success occurred 23 days after the Russians had launched the first-ever human in space, cosmonaut Yuri Gagarin, during an era of intense technological competition between the Russians and Americans called the Space Race.
