Focus Grants are Back!

In partnership with the Department of Veterans Affairs, the Elks National Veterans Service Commission has pledged to help end veteran homelessness, and ensure that every veteran has the safe, stable home they deserve.

Are you ready to join (or continue) the **fight against veteran homelessness**? We have exciting news: your Lodge is eligible to apply for a <u>Focus Grant</u>!

Focus Grants, which range from \$5,000 to \$10,000, can be used to prevent veteran homelessness, help veterans exit homelessness, or assist previously homeless veterans to adjust. Project examples include stocking and managing a food pantry, hosting job fairs or skills classes, planning social outings for veterans, and so much more.

As part of our Welcome Home program, the VA has asked the Elks to add an extra focus on 12 urban areas where the numbers of homeless veterans are highest. These areas are Chicago, IL; New York, NY; Washington, D.C.; San Diego, CA; Los Angeles, CA; Loma Linda, CA; San Francisco, CA; Seattle, WA; Miami, FL; Tampa-Orlando, FL; Las Vegas, NV; and Phoenix, AZ. Focus Grants will be awarded with the goal of distributing funds equally across the 12 locations.

Focus Grants are competitive, so be sure to submit a thorough application. Grant projects must focus on direct service to homeless veterans. Here are a few key ideas to keep in mind as you plan your Focus Grant project:

A complete application and budget must be submitted and approved before funds are mailed. Lodges that receive grants are required to complete a mid-year report halfway through the year. After the project is complete, the Lodge must also complete a final report, including documentation of all funds spent.

Projects must focus on direct service to homeless veterans. When we read your application, we want to know how your Lodge members will personally engage with the veterans you serve. Donations of funds and supplies are not allowable. Click the link to read the full <u>Guidelines</u>.

Focus Grants are competitive, so be sure to submit a thorough application. If you submit a first-time Focus Grant application, we will reach out to schedule a phone call. Even for experienced volunteers, it is standard for us to have feedback on applications. We get to learn from the insights of volunteers across the country; we want to share their lessons to help you make your project plan even stronger.

Bigger isn't always better. Focus Grants can be anywhere from \$5,000 to \$10,000. Successful Focus Grant projects come in all sizes, and we suggest applying only for the amount you need. Also consider the volunteer capacity of your Lodge members when deciding on your budget.

Think about which organizations you will partner with on your project. Staff in the community who serve veterans full-time can help you connect with veterans and understand their needs. Check out our best tips on <u>how to build Focus Grant partnerships</u> with HUD-VASH departments, Community Resource and Referral Centers nonprofits, veterans' shelters, and other organizations.

The application will open on **April 1, 2023** and can be accessed through the Elks webpage,/ grants dashboard at <u>elks.org/cip/dashboard</u>. We hope you're ready to join us in the effort to end veteran homelessness. **Together, we can make a difference!**
