Benevolence is in our Name.

Because you are an Elk, I am sure that you contribute to nonprofit charities throughout the year. Maybe it's your grandchild's PTA fundraiser, the annual appeal to purchase a meal for the needy at Thanksgiving, the Salvation Army red bucket in-front of the store at Christmas. Do you say yes when the grocery store or restaurant asks you to "round up" for the charity they decided to support? Of course, you support Harry Anna. But what do you know about Elk's National Foundation? When you support The Elks National Foundation (ENF), you are supporting a charity that supports the communities where Elks live and work. Last year, the members and lodges in Florida donated \$433,292.23 to ENF. It sounds like a lot of money. But I bet you did not realize ENF sent more than \$1.638.400 back to Florida. I say, "more than" because there were 16 scholarships awarded to Florida students that were not projected in these numbers, most of the relief to the victims of Hurricane lan are also not reflected in these numbers, the travel expenses of those staff who attended our schools and seminars are not included, and neither is the Drug Awareness Program. To accomplish that kind of return, the Elks National Foundation must invest its capital carefully, and keep its operating costs low. In fact, the ENF spends 92% of their income on direct mission expenses. Less than 8% is spent on advertising and administration. Compare that to the administrative and advertising expenses of the top charities in the country - according to Charitywatch.com, Feeding America spends 21%, Toys 4 Tots spends 21%, Salvation Army spends 18% and even the beloved American Red Cross spends over 9%. Florida was nowhere near the top of the heap when it came to reaping benefits of our top-rated charity. There are a lot of different formulas for the different programs, but it is simple to understand that the more your state gives, the more your state gets in return.

So I ask: "Can you make a donation today?"

Can you log in at Elks.org/enf and make a recurring donation by joining the Fidelity Club? \$15 per month is the default, but they will accept a \$5 donation if that is all you can budget. If that does not appeal right now, you can also log in and make a one time donation. You can choose which ENF program you want to support. YOUR donation will help YOUR Lodge get bigger grants, YOUR community get more services, and YOUR state get more money for our major projects. And, for some of you, it will help YOU pay less in taxes. When you hear the word Benevolence – Think, **"ENF!"**

In the September issue of the Antlers we promised to attempt to explain the difference between the American Legion (AL) and Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW). These are perhaps two of the "most famous" associations and they are also the oldest.

The AL started out in World War I as a group of 20 officers asked to find ways to improve the troops' morale. The AL was chartered by Congress in 1919 as a patriotic veterans' association. The AL has grown from a group of war-weary WWI veterans to one of the most influential non-profit, public service organization in the United States of America. The AL currently employs over 4 million people in 14,000 positions worldwide.

The VFW traces it's roots back to 1899 with 2 veteran organizations: The veterans of the Spanish American War (1898) and the Philippine American War (1899-19020). These two were created as local organizations to provide rights and benefits for service. Many veterans arrived home wounded or sick and there was no medical care or pensions for them. They were left to care for themselves. The VFW was formed on September 17, 1914, where the two organizations merged into one. By 1915, membership had grown to 5,000, and by 1936, when it became a government-funded, non-profit organization the membership was nearly 200,000. Membership today is about 1.4 million people.

Originally the clubs' purpose was to help veterans and service members navigate their military benefits and get the respect they deserve. Fighting for better active duty pay, improving housing for active duty families and ensuring that the VA's medical systems could properly care for veterans. They provided assistance programs such as free, professional help filing or appealing a VA claim, scholarships, emergency financial relief, student veteran support and mental health wellness resources.

As you can see these two clubs are a lot more a like than they are different. Their major differences are evident in their eligibility to join.

The requirements for membership for the VFW are more demanding. Members must have received a campaign medal, served 30 consecutive days or 60 non-consecutive days, or received imminent danger or hostile fire pay at any time. The VFW also restricts membership to members on the battlefield on foreign soil or hostile waters. This can be proven by a full list of qualifying medals or badges or a receipt of Hostile Fire Pay or Imminent Danger pay.

To join the AL you must have served at least one day of federal active duty in the US Armed Forces since Dec 7, 1941, and were honorably discharged or are still serving honorably. The AL also opened membership to Merchant Marines, AL Auxiliary (female immediate family members) and the Sons of the AL, because of the looser requirements for membership the AL is larger and has greater resources.

Both the AL and the VFW have gone beyond just veterans helping veteran companions. From their beginning to provide financial, social, and emotional support to veterans and their dependents...to being the leaders of community involvement in areas such as mentoring youth groups, assistance in community kitchens and volunteering for blood donations (to name a few).
