Greeting fellow Elks



Thank you so much for the generous donation of \$2,000 provided to us here at the Osceola Pregnancy Center! We are so very grateful for the financial gift and we are happy to acknowledge it in our next newsletter and on our social media platforms.

Your gift will support our Wee Care Baby Boutique Program. We are currently serving about 200 clients who are receiving the necessities for their baby. While most of the baby items are donated, your monetary donation helps us to provide the NEW Infant and Toddler car seats. As well as universal strollers, diapers of all sizes, baby wipes, baby wash, lotion, oil and cream. Our baby boutique clientele is UP 99% this year as compared to 2023 thus far.

While our free pregnancy testing statistics remain about the same, those seeking an abortion have risen by 90%. We are a pro-life ministry and offer FREE ultrasounds, abortion education and lay counseling giving the women and men seeking an abortion the opportunity to change their minds about the abortion and allow the pregnancy to continue with a good plan for all involved.

The Osceola Pregnancy Center is a Christian ministry that serves the community by helping families to make LIFE-AFFIRMING choices for the sake of the baby and the emotional, physical and spiritual health of the mother and father. But we don't stop there the Osceola Pregnancy Center supports women and families throughout their pregnancy and can be of assistance until the child is about 2 years old. Our client return rate is 79%. And we have served this community for 35 years.

We could NOT accomplish this type of assistance to the women and families without partners like you.

Thank you for your generous donation of \$2,000 to support our services. For over 50 years, The Opportunity Center, Inc. has provided services for adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities in Osceola County. Contributions, such as yours, help support the Opportunity Center's mission of empowering individuals by providing employment placement, personcentered training, and community integration for adults with disabilities.

The Opportunity Center is dedicated to ensuring that people with disabilities live full and productive lives in the least restrictive environments possible. Services are provided that support adults with disabilities to participate in valued roles in the community, gain access to community-based services and employment, and assist individuals to reside in their preferred living arrangements. At the Adult Day Training Program, skill acquisition is provided in the areas of self-advocacy, adaptive and social skills that are age and culturally appropriate, activities of daily living, and many more. Currently, we also provide transportation services to over 90% of the individuals attending our program. This includes taking them to and from their home every day as well as community outings during the day.

Recognizing the importance of community integration, clients are encouraged to participate in outings or volunteer opportunities in the community. Volunteer opportunities include cleaning local parks, delivering meals through the Meals on Wheels program, cleaning the Kissimmee Welcome Center, and packaging recycled soap that is sent to third world countries through the Wash Foundation. These outings allow our clients to be active and visible members of our local community while practicing the skills they learned at the day program.
